THE LITURGY OF NEW FIRE

Dear friends in Christ, on this most holy morning, when our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life, the Church invites believers throughout the world to a time of vigil and prayer. This is the Passover of the Lamb, Jesus Christ. We remember his death and celebrate his resurrection, confident that we shall share his victory and live with him forever in God.

The fire is lit

Holy God, you gave your Name to Moses from the burning bush. By the blessing of this new fire, bring us to stand with awe on this holy ground, our eyes alight with the glory we have seen in Christ, and our hearts aflame with resurrection joy, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Paschal (Easter) Candle is brought forward

Jesus Christ, yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, Alpha and Omega. All time belongs to Christ and all the ages. To Christ be glory and power through every age for ever. **Amen.**

By his holy and glorious wounds, may Christ our Lord guard us and keep us. **Amen.**

May the light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds. **Thanks be to God.**

*We process into the church and stand in the pews. As the Paschal Candle is brought to its place, we pause three times and chant The light of Christ. **Thanks be to God.***

EXSULTET

The proclamation is sung by soloist until...

It is right to give our thanks and praise

The soloist continues...

COLLECT

Eternal giver of life and light, this holy morning shines with the radiance of the risen Christ: renew your Church with the Spirit given to us in baptism, that we may worship you in sincerity and truth, and shine as a light in the world; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**

Second Reading: Romans 6.3-11. Read by Darren Steele.

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptised into Christ Jesus were baptised into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

The Gospel according to St. Matthew 28.1-10

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb.

And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men. But the angel said to the women, 'Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. RENEWAL OF BAPTISM VOWS

Now that our Lenten observance is ended, let us reaffirm the promises made at our baptism.

Do you turn to Christ? Do you repent of your sins?

Do you renounce all that is evil?

I do.

I ask you now to reaffirm as yours the faith of the Church.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in God the Son?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith. We believe in one God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Amen.

Will you each, by God's grace, strive to live as a disciple of Christ, loving God with your whole heart, and your neighbour as yourself, until your life's end?

I will with God's help.

God our creator, Rock of our salvation, has given us new birth by water and the Spirit, and forgiven our sins through Jesus Christ our Risen Lord. May God keep us faithful to our calling now and forever. **Amen.**

Living God, make us apostles of the risen Christ. Give us joyful hearts, words of hope, and grace to recognise the Lord Jesus when he meets us, wherever we are on the road.

The blessing of the Living God, who brings light out of darkness, be upon you now and forever. **Amen.**

The blessing of the Risen Christ, who sends you as apostles into all the world be upon you now and forever. **Amen.**

The blessing of the Holy Spirit, who fills the church with joy and praise, be upon you now and forever. **Amen.**

The blessing of our God, the holy and glorious Trinity, be upon you and remain with you now, and forever. **Amen.**
