Helping Zimbabwe Farmers Rediscover the Joy of an Abundant Crop



Zimbabwe is suffering from critically low food reserves, as climate change brings harsher and more frequent drought. While the country struggles to adapt, the war in Ukraine is compounding the economic crisis. Your support can help farmers become more resilient and rediscover the joy of putting food on their family's table.

Zimbabwe is suffering from critically low food reserves, as climate change brings harsher and more frequent drought. The impacts of the climate crisis, rising inflation and the ongoing war in Ukraine are making the economic situation worse by driving up food prices. Families already living in poverty and hunger are now being plunged further into crisis. Priscilla lives in Zimbabwe, where years of drought decimated her crops and left her unable to feed her family.



"We could spend the whole day without any food," she explained. "Then we would have one meal in the evening, when we would share the very little we had."

Her community has been severely affected by years of drought which decimated her crops and left her unable to feed her family. Priscilla would spend the whole day

without food and have just one meal in the evening which she would share with her children.

Act for Peace's local partner, Christian Care, with support from the Australian Government through the Australian NGO Cooperation Program (ANCP), is working closely with communities like Priscilla's to provide training in the latest climate-resilient farming techniques. The farmers are also receiving basic seed and grain packs, fertilisers, and small livestock that are helping them grow food sustainably.

"It is the difference between giving someone a fish, and a fishing rod," said Priscilla. "I teach many people in my community what I have learnt so that everyone benefits. Now I eat almost all the foods I like. I can send my children to school and am sure they are going to lead a better life. We thank you for the support you gave to the people of Zimbabwe. May the Lord bless you."

Your Christmas Bowl gifts will help families like Priscilla's to be more food secure and better withstand the climate and economic shocks facing the country.

Community Event

Members of HTW congregation and Residents of The Village Williamstown recently took practical steps in support of the Synod's resolution on Violence against Women and HTW's Parish Engagement Plan against Family Violence. At a recent Table Top Sale held in TVW's Community Centre, Janice Schmidt and Dawn Riddell organized and ran a Christmas Bake Stall which raised \$500. Half of this has been donated to the McAuley Community Services for Women) the Women's Refuge in Footscray) and half to HTW' Community Lunch Program. They have thus contributed half of HTW's 2022-23 budgeted Charity Donation. At the same sale the Village Williamstown's Craft Group raised \$566 for McAuley Community Services. Their stall included raffling gingerbread creations 'Santa's Express' and a street scene which made \$171. The Craft Group were also able to include in their donation to this Charity a number of Christmas decorations which hadn't sold together with a few small bits and pieces suitable for mini presents for the women and children housed in the Refuges run by McAuley.
