REFLECTION

Word for the day – Trisagion: A hymn with a triple invocation of God as holy. [Late Middle English from the Greek tris '3 times' + hagios 'holy'] We do a few things differently in Lent to mark the season as solemn. Among them, we swap from The Gloria to the Trisagion, and we won't be saying or singing Alleluia until Easter. The journey through the church year changes in energy and mood, and while the Lenten mood is sombre, it isn't miserable. It is a suitably respectful time to remember all that Jesus did out of God's love for us and for our salvation.

He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight people, were saved through water. And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him. 

WOMEN OF HOLY TRINITY (WOHT)



If you're not comfortable with being recorded, we will gratefully receive written recollections of up to 1000 words that can then be read by someone else. Thank you to those who have already done so.


HISTORY IN PICTURES
