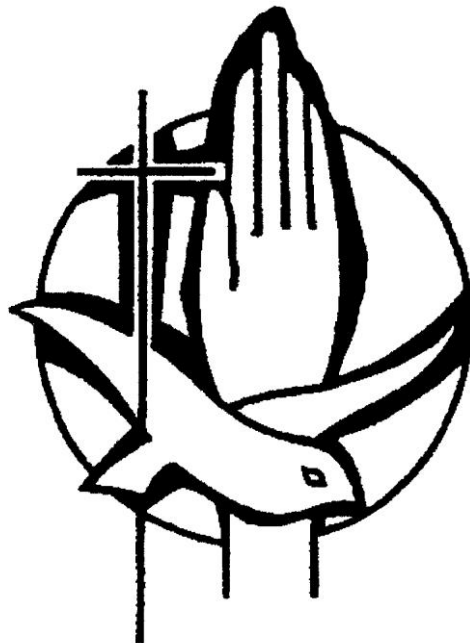

The Second Reading Hebrews 12.18-29. Read by Marie Calthorpe at 8am, Sue Phillips at 10am.

You have not come to something that can be touched, a blazing fire, and darkness, and gloom, and a tempest, and the sound of a trumpet, and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that not another word be spoken to them. (For they could not endure the order that was given, 'If even an animal touches the mountain, it shall be stoned to death.' Indeed, so terrifying was the sight that Moses said, 'I tremble with fear.') But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel. See that you do not refuse the one who is speaking; for if they did not escape when they refused the one who warned them on earth, how much less will we escape if we reject the one who warns from heaven! At that time his voice shook the earth; but now he has promised, 'Yet once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heaven.' This phrase 'Yet once more' indicates the removal of what is shaken—that is, created things—so that what cannot be shaken may remain. Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us give thanks, by which we offer to God an acceptable worship with reverence and awe; for indeed our God is a consuming fire.

The question of why disasters happen has plagued people of faith for thousands of years. A part of coping can involve the acknowledgment that there are no simple answers, but also knowing that God is with us in the midst of suffering. For people of faith, our understanding of Scripture can also help or hinder our actions – so it is imperative that we unpack what God says about times of crisis, change and the environment we live in so that we can respond well.

This is the premise of a brand new series of Bible studies produced by *CAN DO* consortium partners of which Anglican Overseas Aid is a member. The studies have been developed by Pacific church leaders, drawing on the voices and experiences of people from the Solomon Islands, Fiji, PNG and Vanuatu.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

Meeting held at 6.30pm Tuesday 4th August 2022

1. Compliance Calendar/Governance:

PC minutes were included in the pew sheet once a month as well as being displayed on the noticeboard in the church. The Parish Engagement Plan is the basis for future plans/actions. The vicar, wardens and treasurer will start reviewing next year's budget. The ADOM land tax statement has been received. A reminder that at the meeting in September plans will be made for the Annual Parish Meeting. Inclusion on the Electoral Roll requires consideration of parishioner's attendance record.

2. Vicar's Report:

The Bible Study programme had started and was well received. Wedding and Baptism enquiries were increasing. The Mary Magdalene Breakfast had been a success – a thought-provoking talk. \$499 had been donated to the Brigidine Asylum Seeker Project and a net figure of \$340 for HT had been raised. Publishing the PC minutes in the pew sheet had been well received. A builder had quoted \$400-500 to repair the outside noticeboard and make the access through double doors which would be less vulnerable to wind. It was agreed to accept this quote and ask the builder to proceed. Elizabeth has a new coach with whom she was pleased. The application to use the exterior of HT church briefly on a video to be produced by a Christian music group was approved. The group was to be sure that any portrayal of the church or the Christian faith was to be positive.

Ministry Student Johnny Maryoe is a real blessing to our parish. Elizabeth will give him the opportunity to lead worship. Elizabeth will have one week annual leave in September. Elizabeth's three-year review as priest-in-charge is due February 2023.

3. Wardens' Report:

A crack in the back wall of the Parish Centre has developed in the mortar near an expansion joint. This will come under the 7year guarantee period and the builder, Con Bourakis will be called in for a meeting with the vicar and wardens. The doors are also difficult to open and starting to rust in places. The old fire hose is to be sealed and the pipe etc removed. The wardens were thanked for their work.

4. Finance Report:

Balance sheets and reports previously circulated

Finance report for July:

- *Over all for Holy Trinity Williamstown income from regular giving is 13% above budget for the year to date (\$61,120 actual to \$54,000 budgeted). In July the monthly giving of \$6,620 was \$1260 more than anticipated.*
- *Running costs of the community centre (\$664) were not offset by income from bookings in June*
- *Wedding income for July was \$0*

- Total income year to date \$79,781 is higher than the budgeted income \$70,230
- Total expenses year to date of \$129,686 are \$7,963 higher than budgeted \$121,210.
- HTW has drawn \$49,391 from reserves to cover the shortfall of the last 9 months

We submitted reports to the magistrate court fund this month. We have received \$3000 since April 1st 2022 for the provision of meals and social contact for needy individuals.

Local Primary Schools would be contacted offering help for the purchase of uniforms where needed from the magistrates' court funds. Any unused funds at the deadline would go to Anglicare Relief.

The Rotary Club had also made a donation of \$1000 towards community lunches and this would be used similarly.

Discussion: Necessary to consider fund raising. HBCC Group list for grants – HT needed to be proactive. Laurence will liaise with Ian to produce a draft budget. The financial report was accepted with thanks to Laurence and Ian

5. Safe Ministries: Child Safety & Prevention of Family Violence

The vicar, Anna, and Scott had completed all three levels. Tom and Ingrid had completed Levels 1&3. The importance of doing this training was, in part, to demonstrate to the wider community that Holy Trinity cares about everyone's well-being. An information session on completing level 1 would be organised for everyone. Anna would check to see if there are any new posters of information for display.

6.Pastoral Care:

Janice was thanked for her consistent caring contacts. Val Dripps and Ann Hodges passed information to her. It was agreed that it was better to sing Happy Birthday during Morning Tea, it was sung at 8am after the recording had been turned off. Elizabeth wanted to build up a team to provide pastoral care including Scott to revive men's fellowship. As Elizabeth had had her 4th vaccination, she could now go into Aged Care facilities

7. St Francis Day Sunday 9th October

It was agreed to keep this a simple, outdoor service starting at 2pm. Blessing the banner and then the pets present. Fliers and posters, A2 & A5, would be circulated in advance. A postcard of the banner with a message in the back would be given to each 'pet'. Pet food shops to be asked to contribute to show bags which Anna volunteered to fill. The HT Trio to be invited to play.

8.September Musical Event

Possibly on 10th September. Scott, Hayden and Anna would discuss and arrange.

9.Other Business

Grants: HBCC Interagency Network a good source of information. Anna had attended a grant writing workshop.
