

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD *(please sit)*

The First Reading: Jeremiah 32.1-3a, 32.6-15. Read by Val Dripps at 8am, Laurence Gray at 10am.

The word that came to Jeremiah from the Lord in the tenth year of King Zedekiah of Judah, which was the eighteenth year of Nebuchadnezzar. At that time the army of the king of Babylon was besieging Jerusalem, and the prophet Jeremiah was confined in the court of the guard that was in the palace of the king of Judah, where King Zedekiah of Judah had confined him. Zedekiah had said, 'Why do you prophesy and say: Thus says the Lord: I am going to give this city into the hand of the king of Babylon, and he shall take it; Jeremiah said, The word of the Lord came to me: Hanamel son of your uncle Shallum is going to come to you and say, 'Buy my field that is at Anathoth, for the right of redemption by purchase is yours.' Then my cousin Hanamel came to me in the court of the guard, in accordance with the word of the Lord, and said to me, 'Buy my field that is at Anathoth in the land of Benjamin, for the right of possession and redemption is yours; buy it for yourself.' Then I knew that this was the word of the Lord. And I bought the field at Anathoth from my cousin Hanamel, and weighed out the money to him, seventeen shekels of silver. I signed the deed, sealed it, got witnesses, and weighed the money on scales. Then I took the sealed deed of purchase, containing the terms and conditions, and the open copy; and I gave the deed of purchase to Baruch son of Neriah son of Mahseiah, in the presence of my cousin Hanamel, in the presence of the witnesses who signed the deed of purchase, and in the presence of all the Judeans who were sitting in the court of the guard. In their presence I charged Baruch, saying, Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel: Take these deeds, both this sealed deed of purchase and this open deed, and put them in an earthenware jar, in order that they may last for a long time. For

thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel: Houses and fields and vineyards shall again be bought in this land.

The Second Reading: 1 Timothy 6.6-19. Read by Val Dripps at 8am, Laurence Gray at 10am.

Of course, there is great gain in godliness combined with contentment; for we brought nothing into the world, so that we can take nothing out of it; but if we have food and clothing, we will be content with these. But those who want to be rich fall into temptation and are trapped by many senseless and harmful

desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, and in their eagerness to be rich some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains. But as for you, man of God, shun all this; pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, gentleness. Fight the good fight of the faith; take hold of the eternal life, to which you were called and for which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses. In the presence of God, who gives life to all things, and of Christ Jesus, who in his testimony before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, I charge you to keep the commandment without spot or blame until the manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ, which he will bring about at the right time—he who is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords. It is he alone who has immortality and dwells in unapproachable light, whom no one has ever seen or can see; to him be honour and eternal dominion. Amen. As for those who in the present age are rich, command them not to be haughty, or to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but rather on God who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share, thus storing up for themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of the life that really is life.

Parish Council Report September 2022

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 4th August 2022, previously circulated were approved

Business Arising: A planning meeting for the High Tea on 2nd October would be held next Thursday 8th September

General Business

Compliance Calendar:

The plan for the coming year would follow the plans in the Parish Engagement Plan.

Under the Governance Review, all staff and volunteers with an organising role would be asked to meet the vicar for a review of their role and prepare a task description for future reference.

The Electoral Roll will be reviewed and preparations for the Annual Parish Meeting are in hand, including the compilation of parish statistics.

The APM would be held in the Parish Centre 11.30am Sunday 27th November, in person only. Voting for Synod Representatives was not needed.

Vicar's Report:

A locum, Rev. Elaine Ryan, would cover during Elizabeth's September leave. Rev Jo Hall would cover on the Wednesday.

Three weddings were taking place during October – 1 with their own priest. Enquiries for weddings and baptisms were increasing – it was to be made very clear on the website that HT would only hold/approve weddings in the Anglican tradition – HTW is not a venue for hire. Elizabeth would bless the fleet on Saturday 1st October

Wardens' Report:

Investigation of the crack in the north wall of the Parish Centre was pending. (*UPDATE: the builder of the Parish Centre will be undertaking repair works in September*)

Three electrical items – a flickering outside light, 1 outside light not working, the effectiveness of the solar panels on the parish Centre roof – to be investigated in the new financial year.

Staffing/volunteer roles were discussed and it was decided to engage in a review process for all. (See Compliance Calendar)

A new Church Warden would be needed for the coming year as Tom was stepping down. Tom was most warmly thanked for his contribution as Warden in so many ways.

The Wardens were thanked for all they do and prayer was offered for Jill's speedy recovery.

Finance Report:

2 possible budgets for the coming year had been circulated prior to the meeting. HTW had had a deficit budget for the last 3 years, much due to the complications of the pandemic and lockdowns. The good news was the state of the reserve and they were carefully stewarded, and it had been agreed that they should be used to enhance the church's engagement with the community. However, it was important to offset operational costs through fund-raising. The diocese had been applied to for the release of the \$26,000 insurance money owed – it was still awaited. In whatever way it could be adjusted, the budget for the current year would still be a deficit budget. *(UPDATE: the new stipend determination by Archbishop in Council, published after the meeting, will be incorporated into the Budget)*

Following discussion, it was agreed:

(i) that it was vital to find a member of the congregation to act as Fund Raiser with a team, with enthusiasm, ideas and energy.

(ii) there would be no engagement of an organist but volunteers and the HTW Trio would provide music for worship services.

(iii) A budget line of \$1000 to fund raise for charitable causes would be included.

Whatever cuts/savings made, it was strongly agreed that it was vital to keep a full-time vicar.

(iv) Once the acquittals for current grants had been given, Anna and Laurence would work on further grant applications.

Laurence and Ian were warmly thanked for all their work and care of the church's finances.

Safe Ministry:

Signed statements of commitment to all provisions for Child Safety were completed. The register was up to date.

The training Platform for Level 1, compulsory for all involved in any role in the church however minor, had been redesigned so that a whole group could undertake it together, without then having to do it as individuals. Elizabeth would organise a meeting when this could be done.

Pastoral Care:

Elizabeth had at last been able to visit Aged Care homes and had visited Marjorie Todd in Trugo.

Elizabeth was planning a meeting with all the team after her annual leave. Scott and Elizabeth would meet to plan for the resumption of the Men's Ministry.

Sadness was expressed at the death of Bryan Matty, condolences had been passed to his family.

Musical Event on 10th September:

It was agreed to use the poster designed by Anna, and the event would be given as much publicity as possible.

This time was intended as a model for future similar events – everyone was welcome to come as audience, not just participants

Scott and Anna were thanked for their work in preparing this.

St Francis' Day Pet Blessing Service on 9th October:

As agreed previously, this would be a simple service in the afternoon outside, weather permitting, or in the church.

Elizabeth would design a poster & fliers and produce a postcard of the banner to be given to each pet present. The Banner will be formally blessed at this service.

Other Business:

(i)The organisers of the group wishing to hold after-school activities in the Parish Centre had confirmed that, as teachers, they had all got the necessary government Child Safety Checks. Elizabeth would follow up their request.

(ii)Westbourne School would be holding their Carol Service at HTW

(iii)Elizabeth was focusing on preparations for Lighting of the Lamp, and contacting those groups connected. It was suggested that local schools etc. could be made aware and the possibility of including prayers for the situation in the Ukraine be considered.

(iv)Janice announced that she will be unable to continue organising the Christmas Fayre. It was agreed that this important fund raising opportunity, always much welcomed by parishioners, must continue. Janice would contact the cake & shortbread supplier for costs, it would cut costs if the shortbread dough were supplied in rolls to be baked in the Parish Centre, and this was agreed. A request for help to make this all happen would be made to the congregation.

Janice was very warmly thanked for all her hard work over many years making the Christmas Fayre such a success. We look forward to welcoming a new team to this coordinating role.

There being no further business, the meeting closed with the grace.
