Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armour of light; let us live honourably as in the day, not in revelling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarrelling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

## Parish Council Report – Meeting 3 November 2022

Apologies: Tom, Anna, Ingrid, Scott

Present: Rev. Elizabeth (chair), Janice, Jill, Laurence

Opened with prayer.

1. Annual Meeting Preparations: Eucharistic Assistant list approved. Electoral Roll Reviewed. Financial Strategy: the new parish council will need to discuss details of a financial plan for parish growth and reframing that can then be discussed with Bishop Kate.
2. Vicar's report: after Christmas, the vicar will move her day off to Monday (from Friday). "Lighting of the Lamp" preparations are well underway. Preparations for Christmas services are going well, this will include a call-out for various volunteers need to support these. Christmas Fare preparations are being co-ordinated by Barbara Phoenix and other community members along with Wilma. Johnny Maryoe will conclude his student placement Sunday 20 November. Suitable gift ideas were discussed.
3. Wardens' report: quote for the removal of the bee hive in the vicarage chimney that had resulted in bees entering the vicarage kitchen, approved. Email from the Gardening Group discussed, the final plan for the vicarage garden will need to be project managed, and it was agreed that quotes for regular professional grounds maintenance should be explored. Add this as its own item in future budgets distinct from Church Maintenance, and note that it can be funded from the site maintenance fund.
4. Financial report - Treasurer: *Following further information only available at the end of October from the diocese records need to be adjusted.*
  - Overall for Holy Trinity Williamstown income from regular giving is 45% above budget. The monthly giving of \$7,787 was \$2,429 more than anticipated.
  - Running costs of the community centre (\$425) were not offset by income from hire ( \$1350)
  - Wedding income for July was \$750
  - Income for the month was \$12,501 is higher than the budgeted income \$6,320 by 97%
  - Expenses have been offset with a distribution of interest from Anglican funds investment of \$28, 593.
  - Total expenses for the month of have been reduced due to this distribution resulting in an operating profit for the month of \$25 921 against a monthly expected short fall of \$5778. \$,173 are

\$3,075 higher than budgeted \$12,098. This profit has been credit back to the Nicolson Bequest.

Errors in the Assessment have been clarified and the difference paid. Outgoings are more than income. All information is now with the Auditor.

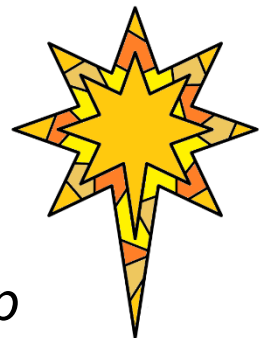
