CONVERSATIONS AT THE CENTRE

Our Conversations are open to anyone, so please bring any friends if you think they would find our topics interesting.

Our final Conversation for 2022 will be Wednesday 2nd November with Dr. Christopher Ringrose, Co-Editor, *Journal of Postcolonial Writing* Co-Editor, *Studies in World Literature* (Ibidem Press/Columbia UP) on the topic "The Importance of Photographs." 'The Spiritual Dimension of Photographs'?

It will allow us to discuss the ways in which photographs in our possession (whether traditional or digital) have become a way of meditating on things usually regarded as spiritual -- connection with the unseen, transcending time, reflecting on our place in creation and our relation to others. Parish Council Report October 2022

Apologies: Tom Verghese, Anna Grove

Present: Rev Elizabeth Murray (Chairman) Jill Ringrose, Janice Schmidt, Scott Phillips, Laurence Grey, Ingrid Dodd

Opening Prayer: The vicar opened the meeting with prayer

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 1st. September, previously circulated, were approved

Business Arising from the Minutes:

(i) Community Music Jam – it was agreed that it had gone very well and had been most enjoyable. It would be good to have song sheets next time – Janice offered a number. The next one would be held probably in March 2023

(ii) High Tea – A great success. The final income was still to be advised. It was good to have many outsiders present. The vicar thanked the organisers: Judy White, Wilma Robarts and Ingrid Dodd for their hard work. It was hoped to have a tea (not so lavish) combined with a vicarage tour next year.

General Business:

1. Compliance Calendar: Annual financial report and Q1 reports in hand. The vicar reminded those present that any reports they have to submit to the Annual Parish Meeting were due by 27th October, to be sent in Word Document format by email to the vicar.

2. Vicar's Report: Work on the outside Notice Board was progressing. Mr Danaher had worked on both the roofs of the church and of the Parish Centre.

3. Wardens' Report: (i) Scott had met Con Bourakis: the Parish Centre side door had been rehung and the glass reset, the internal doors had also been adjusted – all work under warranty. The rust on the door handles had been removed – it can be prevented by rubbing with a light oil from time to time.

(ii) A quote for \$1800 to provide flashing on the back wall of the Parish Centre to prevent water coming into the building was accepted – work of on-going maintenance not under original warranty.

(iii) Cracking on back wall could be fixed by repointing – no structural issues involved.

(iv) The provision of the paling fence at the side of the vicarage garden had been queried – this work had been done with the requisite permissions from the heritage bodies, it had replaced the existing chicken wire fence and was essential for the security of the vicarage and matched paling fencing elsewhere on site. HBCC advised that a retrospective permit be applied for, which is being done.

(v) The suggestion that the drainage/sewerage of the Parish Centre needed attention would be further clarified by Ingrid. If necessary, Red Dog Plumbing would be contacted and the decommissioned fire hose under the fig tree could be removed at the same time.

(vi) An electrician was needed to deal with the flashing light at the back of the building and to fix the front spotlight.

(vii) The vicar and Scott would meet with the Parish administrator for regular review.

4. Finance Report: The reports had been previously circulated.

(i) The monthly narrative for September:

Finance report for Sept 2022 - Laurence Gray, Treasurer

Submitted to the Parish Council meeting Oct 6th

- Over all for Holy Trinity Williamstown income from regular giving is 11% above budget. The monthly giving of \$5,972 was \$612 more than anticipated.

- Running costs of the community centre (\$425) were not offset by income from hire (\$1350)

- Wedding income for July was \$750

- Income for the month was \$10,664 is higher than the budgeted income \$6,320

- Total expenses for the month of \$15,173 are \$3,075 higher than budgeted \$12,098

- HTW has drawn \$4,909 from reserves to cover the shortfall of September

(ii) The preliminary annual figures were discussed:

The cost of locums during the year was discussed as it had come to more than budgeted for. The diocese requires Holy Communion to be provided every Sunday except in exceptional circumstances, when an authorised lay minister could provide the reserved sacrament – Scott was willing to be trained for this role.

The figures for the stipends had only just been published.

Laurence underlined the fact that the parish was still running a deficit budget. It was agreed that the new Parish Council would agree points for discussion which would then be taken to a meeting of the bishop, Rev Elizabeth the wardens and the treasurer. It would be necessary to have a plan to work on with the diocese, who would hopefully help with strategy and financial advice. The financial situation of the parish will form part of Rev. Elizabeth's 3-year appointment review.

It was likely that the way the diocese 'does parish' will be discussed at synod next week. The assumption was still that the stipend would be paid from plate giving – an outdated assumption.

The new Parish Assessment had been received which showed a \$10,000 difference between the HTW figure submitted and the diocese's demand. It was agreed this would be discussed at a meeting between Elizabeth, Laurence and Peter Munns, the chief financial officer of the diocese. Sincere thanks was expressed by Elizabeth and the PC to Laurence and Ian for all their hard work on behalf of the church.

Elizabeth reported that the new donations box was being used regularly, so affirming the decision to install it.

Janice reported that unfortunately the baker was unable to produce cakes and shortbread dough for the Christmas Fayre and Liz White was not able to produce mince pies either. The congregation would be asked for suggestions as to how to proceed with this important fund-raising event.

5. Safe Ministry: Laurence and Janice were reminded to complete Level 3 training. The volunteer register was being reviewed and updated.

6. Pastoral Care: Home Communion were continuing. A meeting of those on the parish Pastoral Care team would be organised. Elizabeth reminded all that she should be advised of any needs, far preferable that she be told several times than that the assumption that someone else has told her be made. Also, as her ministry started just before lockdown, she might not be aware of the absence of some who had been regulars hitherto.

The importance of making links with Aged Care Facilities was agreed – the church is committed to everyone throughout their lives, whether or not they are present in church. Scott would be organising the Men's Church Group resuming in 2023. The importance of the church being open was stressed – it is often visited and performs a Ministry of Presence, a safe place whatever the need or impulse to enter.

7. Worship Times: Ingrid proposed that there could be a single, 9am service during the winter months of June, July and August as a means of uniting the two congregations, both in church and afterwards at Morning Tea. It would avoid a dark start to the day and not cut into the morning when the days are short. Both could be considerations for families with children attending sports or visiting etc. Those preferring a service without music would still be catered for on a Wednesday morning. It was agreed to consider and discuss this proposal further.

There being no further business the meeting closed with the grace.

- **MUSICIANS!** Whether you're on our regular roster of players or would just like to help out for Christmas, let us know what you play and when you're available.
- **READERS!** We know people go on holidays around Christmas, including regular readers, so the call goes out for anyone who might like to read at any of the services. If you've never read in church before, or even if you have, Rev. Elizabeth will be very happy to go through the readings with you beforehand. All we require is a clear speaking voice.

So how many do we need?

- Carols Service: up to 6 readers, and not just Bible readings, poems and other Christmas stories too. If you have a favourite Christmas poem that isn't too long, let Rev. Elizabeth know and she'll think about including it.

- Midnight Mass: up to 2 readers, and someone to lead set prayers written by the vicar.

- **WELCOMERS!** Christmas services attract many visitors to the parish, so it is vitally important for members of the parish family to be on hand to welcome people, hand them service booklets, and answer any questions they may have. Welcomers need to be ready 30mins before each worship service.
