THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD *(please sit)*

The First Reading Acts 2:1-21. Read by Valerie Dripps at 8am, TBC at 10am.

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, 'Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power.' All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, 'What does this mean?' But others sneered and said, 'They are filled with new wine.' But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them: 'Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: "In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those

days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."

WOHT, A GREAT GROUP

a little history and an invitation

Women of Holy Trinity (WOHT), formerly (and also still known by some as) WAGs, the acronym of the "Wednesday Afternoon Group", now meets on the 2nd Thursday of the month at 7.30pm, either at the Parish Centre or in each other's homes as manageable.

Originally we started (set up first by assistant priest, Kim Cruikshank, then developed to its next iteration by assistant priest Susanne Chambers) as a supportive group for the new and young, and not so young, mums at home, in the parish. These mums would bring their lunch and their babies, if any, every second Wednesday afternoon, and have food and a bit of a study of something that would nourish our bodies, minds and souls. We were not a particularly academic nor evangelical group. However, most, though not all, of our studies were put together by some sort of Christian organisation. We took turns in volunteering to lead or to host, as our confidence and circumstances allowed.

Long and enduring friendships developed.

Well that was in the early 90s, and some of our Mums are now Grandmothers! We evolved, non-mums joined us, we started back at work when our littlies were a bit bigger, eventually we could only get together in the evenings, and in the end only once a month, owing to all our family and other commitments.

Our meetings have ranged from 3 people to 10 on occasions, but generally between 5 and 8 of us meet, as circumstances arise. About 15 of us get together for our Christmas meeting/dinner.

Today, the changing patterns of our lives are challenging the patterns of our group again. Although we are still an assorted group consisting of singles, younger and older mums, and even grandmothers, we are at the stage in our lives when either rising up the career ladder, or as a complete opposite, retiring and/or "tree-changing", or moving out of Melbourne to be closer to children and grandchildren, has led us to renew our group. We have always welcomed new people, but without a formal "written invitation"!

There is no "wrong" age group.

THE INVITATION

Now we are actively inviting anyone within the parish, new or "been here forever", to join us, if you would like to, and see if we "suit you"!

We normally meet on the 2nd Thursday of the month, **our next meeting will be at the Parish Centre on Thursday, 9th June, at 7.30pm.** If shipping and posting go to plan we will be starting looking at our new study, Sr Joan Chittister's book "The Gift of Years". If the vagaries of international shipping and Australia post let us down, we will be finishing the 3rd section of the Lenten study from "The King's Speech".


