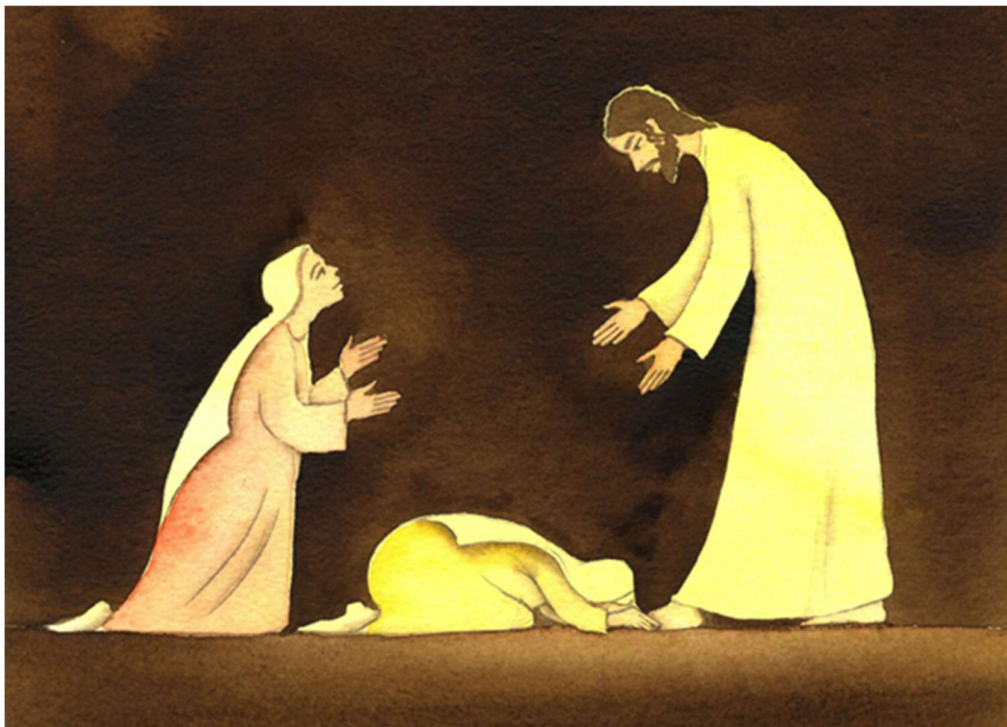

8. THE FIRST READING *A New Testament reading*

A reading from The Acts of the Apostles 2.14a, 36-41

Read by a volunteer at 8am, Sue Phillips at 10am.

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and
addressed them: 'Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem,
let this be known to you, and listen to what I say.

Therefore let the entire house of Israel know with certainty that
God has made him both Lord and Messiah, this Jesus whom
you crucified.'

Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart and said
to Peter and to the other apostles, 'Brothers, what should we
do?' Peter said to them, 'Repent, and be baptized every one

of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you, for your children, and for all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to him.'

And he testified with many other arguments and exhorted them, saying, 'Save yourselves from this corrupt generation.' So those who welcomed his message were baptized, and that day about three thousand persons were added.

10. THE SECOND READING *A New Testament reading, usually a Letter*

A reading from the First Letter of Peter 1.13-25.

Read by a volunteer at 8am. Sue Phillips at 10am

Therefore prepare your minds for action; discipline yourselves; set all your hope on the grace that Jesus Christ will bring you when he is revealed. Like obedient children, do not be conformed to the desires that you formerly had in ignorance. Instead, as he who called you is holy, be holy yourselves in all your conduct; for it is written, 'You shall be holy, for I am holy.' If you invoke as Father the one who judges all people impartially according to their deeds, live in reverent fear during the time of your exile.

You know that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your ancestors, not with perishable things like silver or gold, but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without defect or blemish. He was destined before the foundation of the world, but was revealed at the end of the ages for your sake. Through him you have come to trust in God, who raised him from the dead and gave him glory, so that your faith and hope are set on God.

Now that you have purified your souls by your obedience to the truth so that you have genuine mutual love, love one another deeply from the heart. You have been born anew, not of perishable but of imperishable seed, through the living and enduring word of God.

For 'All flesh is like grass and all its glory like the flower of grass. The grass withers, and the flower falls, but the word of the Lord endures for ever.' That word is the good news that was announced to you.

know. If you do not wish to receive communion and would like to
receive a blessing, please come forward and indicate to the priest
your desire for a blessing by crossing your arms in front of you.
You are also welcome to remain in your pew. Ask someone to let
the priest know if you need communion brought to you.*

*Everyone is welcome to light a candle while communion is being
shared. There are two stations available, one to the left of the*

sanctuary, and another at the memorial chapel at the back of the church.

Prayers of Anointing & Healing are available at this time, when all have received communion. Please wait in the front pew near the candle stand to indicate this wish.

Communion is distributed with these or similar words

The blood of Christ the cup of salvation keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**
